We take pleasure in noticing the very cheap and well printed edition of the "Holy Scriptures," published by the "Society for promoting Christian Knowledge," partly intended to supersede the incorrect and illiterate commentaries which have innundated the country, containing well selected, occasionally original, but altogether highly judicious and interesting notes, by eminent characters in the established church, and chiefly under the management of Dr. Mant and the Rev. Mr. D'Oyley. It is neatly and correctly printed, and contains more letter-press, for the price, than will be found in any similar work. The plates are given in a masterly style of outline, and the maps are accurately drawn and neatly engraved. Large paper copies have been printed for more wealthy purchasers.
