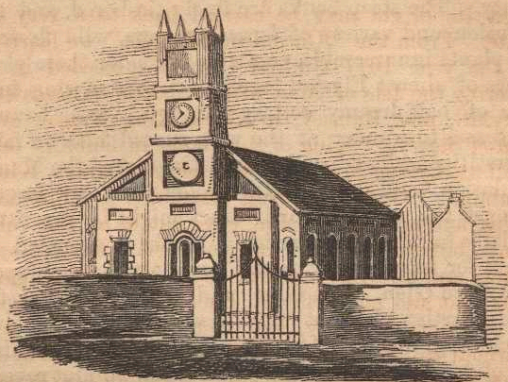

handsome structure, may be seen in *Waterloo-road*. Near it is the Presbyterian Kirk. There are two excellent and well-conducted hotels, the Albert and the Mitre. Near the pier stand the premises of the Steam-packet Company. The harbour will admit vessels drawing seventeen or eighteen feet of water at spring tides, and eleven or twelve feet at neap tides. There is a stone pier which runs out a few hundred feet to sea, and is terminated by a lighthouse. The sands are almost unrivalled both for extent and beauty; and are so firm and level that they constitute the race-course on which the annual races are run.
