THIS work contains a popular scientific account of the most remarkable and picturesque phenomena of the Alpine regions. It commences with a short history of the geology and characteristic vegetation of the mountains on both the Italian and German sides. After this, descriptions are given of the principal mountains, glaciers, lakes, &c. in the central and higher Alps, with explanations of their most striking peculiarities. The glaciers and Alpine torrents are next treated of, with accounts of the most remarkable events and accidents which attend them in these parts. The work concludes with a description of various modes of transport in the Alps, such as that in the high mountains, that of the alpine chamois, goats, &c. in the high pastures, and of the alpine roads, &c. in the high mountains. As the Author is especially remarkable for his knowledge of the Alps, he has been able to give a more accurate and interesting account of the Alps than has been given by any former writer.
